## <u>The Pratt Hall: Bugs & Beetles & Ants,</u> <u>Oh My!</u>

The evaluation we received from Vt Historic Preservation and Architect Michael Gohl is now posted to the Society's web site. One recommendation was to get an expert on pest control to do an evaluation of the building.

We met with an exterminator in March and confirmed the presence of Powder Post Beetles in some of the timber framing, especially in the tower, and Carpenter Ants in one location in the basement. We will probably be treating for them in the fall.

The clock seems to be doing well. (Knock on wood!) Thanks again to the team of folks that helped make the repairs.
