## Chairman's Message:

Every time we get together with other historical societies we hear the same lament. "How do we keep our organization going? How can we attract new, younger members? How do we convince people about the importance and relevance of community heritage work?

Our Society is better off than most in this regard. Still, this summer the Board made a concerted effort to diversify our programs and increase our public engagement. Our thinking was to expose our organization to the community in ways that build interest and appreciation for what we do.

Our decision to mount an exhibit commemorating the 20th Anniversary of the 97 Flood was part of that effort. About 275 people viewed the exhibit at Pratt Hall over three Summer Saturdays and nearly 700 have viewed the exhibit's centerpiece flood video on our Youtube channel. Feedback has been uniformly positive. Some said "I had no idea" about the damage. Some said it was therapeutic. Many thanked us for doing it.

We also decided to take a few risks and do some things outside of our normal comfort zone or traditional role. This included hosting and organizing this year's Farmers' Market, a puppet show in September, another Oktoberfest dinner, and upcoming draft horse wagon rides at Christmas.

It's been a busy Summer and Fall. We hope you have been able to join us or can in the future. As always thanks for your support.

## This Quarter in Montgomery History


Oct - 1809, Measures taken to establish Town's first school.

Nov - 1898, Four Corners (West Hill) Post Office opened


Dec - 1977, St. Bartholomew's renamed Pratt Hall.

## Vermont Civil War Heritage Trail & Gen. Stannard Home

A group of enthusiasts has organized a new trail, roughly following U.S. Route 7, comprised of 15 sites related to Vermont in the Civil War. It includes the St. Albans Raid (Taylor Park and The St. Albans Museum) and Swanton (the Raiders escape route). It's a work in progress and hopes to include more sites in the future.
