THE LALIA PRATT HAYS / AMY BOOTH-MEYERS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AND  
THE CARL (JOE) AND IRENE SCOTT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

BASIS

The scholarships shall be awarded annually to the students with both solid academic accomplishment and greatest financial need as determined by the selection committee. School and community service shall also be evaluated.

METHOD OF SELECTION

The recipients shall be selected annually by a committee named for that purpose by the Board of Directors of the Montgomery Historical Society. This committee shall consist of three to four members – one or two members of the Board of Directors of the Montgomery Historical Society, a community member and an educator.

DURATION

The scholarship shall be one year in duration.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT

The recipient shall be a resident of the Town of Montgomery who has attended a State of Vermont approved secondary school or home-school program.

EDUCATIONAL GOAL

The student must be accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning to include Community College, technical training school, or professional licensure programs e.g. Commercial Driver's License. The student must submit an application stating his/her educational goals and financial needs and the influence of growing up in the Montgomery Community.
